TV's Picture Quality - Types

What types of TV display are currently available?

o LED



LED TVs are a type of LED/LCD TV that uses light-emitting diodes (LEDs) to backlight the display instead of fluorescent lights (CCFLs - used in the older LCD TVs) LED backlight flows through a series of filters and polarizing layers.

O QLED



QLED (Samsung) = LED TV + Quantum Dots (semiconductor nanocrystals which can produce pure monochromatic red, green, and blue light).

OLED



OLED (LG) (Organic light-emitting diode) uses an organic substance that glows when an electric current is introduced. OLED technology energizes and lights up each individual pixel independently and can go to complete blackness.

Features - HDR

HDR greatly increases the range of color, brightness and contrast on a TV to produce a more realistic image.







Features - HDR

High Dynamic Range (HDR)

- HDR greatly increases the range of color, brightness and contrast on a TV to produce a more realistic image.
- Brightness: A normal TV puts out around 100 300 "nits" of brightness. An HDR TV can in theory produce up to 5,000 nits.

Note: Generally TVs that claim to be HDR or "HDR compatible" may be able to only play HDR content, but not have full HDR picture quality.




Screen Size

How Large a Screen Do You Need?

An old 32-inch 4:3 screen is 25.6" wide and 19.2" tall.

Need a digital 43 inch 16:9 screen (36.6 " wide and 20.6" tall) to get equivalent height.



TV OVER THE INTERNET

Why TV Over the Internet?

Most people have received video over cable in the past 30 years

Sources of dissatisfaction with cable:

- Rates
- Customer service
- Packaging of Programs

Therefore other sources for video are developing, including "over-the-top" (OTT) (video over the Internet)

Internet Video or Over-the-Top Video (OTT)

OTT is streaming video to your TV over the Internet. (movies, TV shows, clips, etc.)

OTT is often referred to as "over-the-top" because these services ride on top of the service you already get – <u>except you do need Internet</u> <u>service</u> for it to work (usually from your cable provider)

Can choose one channel e.g. Netflix or a package (similar to a cable tier) e.g, Slingbox TV to get programming or a "Buffet of Packages"













ROKU Smart TVs to get Internet Programming



ROKU has also placed its streaming media player facilities directly into TV sets (similar to a smart TV) instead of having to hook up a ROKU device separately. TV Manufacturers of the "ROKU TV" include - Haier, Hisense, Insignia, Sharp.

Generally cheaper than main brand smart TVs. Supports 4K content, easy to use to get Internet content. Some Roku devices support HDR content.

What an AppleTV Player May produce on a TV screen



The Weakest Link

"The picture doesn't look as good as in the store!" - remember "An army moves as slow as its slowest man"....

Similary....

To play 4K (or HDR) **content** (from a 4K HDR Blue Ray disk for example) the **source device** must be a 4K or UHD or HDR capable Roku Player, or 4K UHD HDR Blue ray player etc. **the connections** (wires) 4 K capable HDMI 2 (not HDMI1) including HDMI 2 outlets on the TV and the **Television itself** should be 4K/HDR

External Devices

When you buy a new 4K TV look for the latest HDMI connection outlets on the back of the TV called "HDCP2.2 Outlets" (High – bandwidth digital Content Protection) which will support 4K content from 4K devices being attached (like the Roku 4K streaming media player).





Latest HDMI outlets that support 4K

Pros and Cons of Video over the Internet

Free offerings: YouTube, ad-supported sites

Subscription offerings: e.g., Netflix, SlingTV, CBS All Access

Real Time or "live" programming currently limited but getting better

Requires high-speed Internet service

On demand selection of programming and ability to pause or fast forward very useful

Costs add up if subscribe to several channels; operation may be complicated

Over the Air TV

June 12, 2009: FCC-mandated switch from analog to digital signals for <u>local broadcast stations such as WETA,NBC, ABC, UNIVISION</u>

With new digital technology, broadcast TV pictures appear crisp, not "snowy

Channel 7 – WJLA, ABC

Can receive High Definition (HD) TV or Standard definition channels. For example:

7.1 HD

7.2 SD Me-TV

7.3 SD WJLA CMT

TV Set Needed (to get OTA)

- Digital TV
 - ■To receive HD signals, need an HDTV (720p or 1080p or 4K)
- Analog TV (older type of TV)
 - Requires digital-to-analog converter box
 - Old TV's (electronics) can be disposed of free of charge 7 days a week (all opening hours) at the County Landfill sites (West Ox Road or Lorton)

NOTE - Rooftop antennas/masts MUST BE GROUNDED!!

FOR OTA TV Antenna Needed The higher the better











Need to scan for channels

- Go to Menu Change input to "Over the air"
- Scan for available channels. Will only get local broadcast channels – NOT HBO, History Channel, or similar cable-only channels
- Rescan regularly, as channels are added frequently

Choosing Services

Cutting costs

Pare down services

Switch providers

Switch type of source: cable, OTA, OTT

Try to get promotional pricing (not regular published rates), especially when switching – get promo prices in hand to negotiate best deal
