

What is SNAP?

Not snapping fingers

Not snapping photos




This SNAP behavior can be very inconvenient. Sometimes it can happen accidentally.

1. Open the Windows menu by tapping the key or clicking the screen button

2. In the menu, open the Settings application



3. In the Settings application, select System



4. In the System screen, select **Multitasking** in the left column

The Windows main menu

- The Windows 10 menu appears when you tap the H key or click the H button in the lower left corner of your screen
