The Threat

- Gadgets, if left enabled, may allow attackers to take complete control of a individual's computer
- Windows Vista and Windows 7 are affected
- Windows XP and Windows Server are not impacted
- Microsoft is unlikely to remedy this problem with Windows 8 being imminent (opinion)



The Solution

Microsoft has provided a "Fix it" to <u>disable</u>
 Gadgets and Sidebar ; look for the following icon
