# What is SNAP?





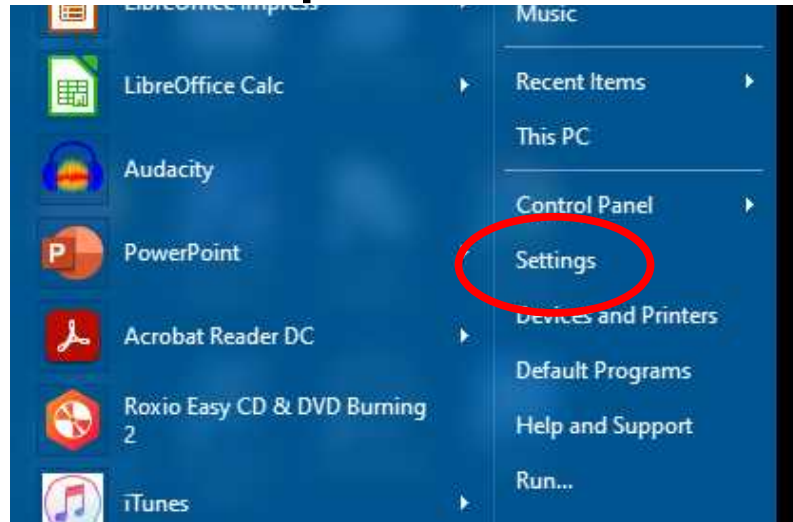
Not snapping photos

- By default, Windows 10 **auto resizes a window to full screen** if you drag the top edge of the window above the top of the screen or drag the window to a corner of the screen.

This SNAP behavior can be very inconvenient. Sometimes it can happen accidentally.

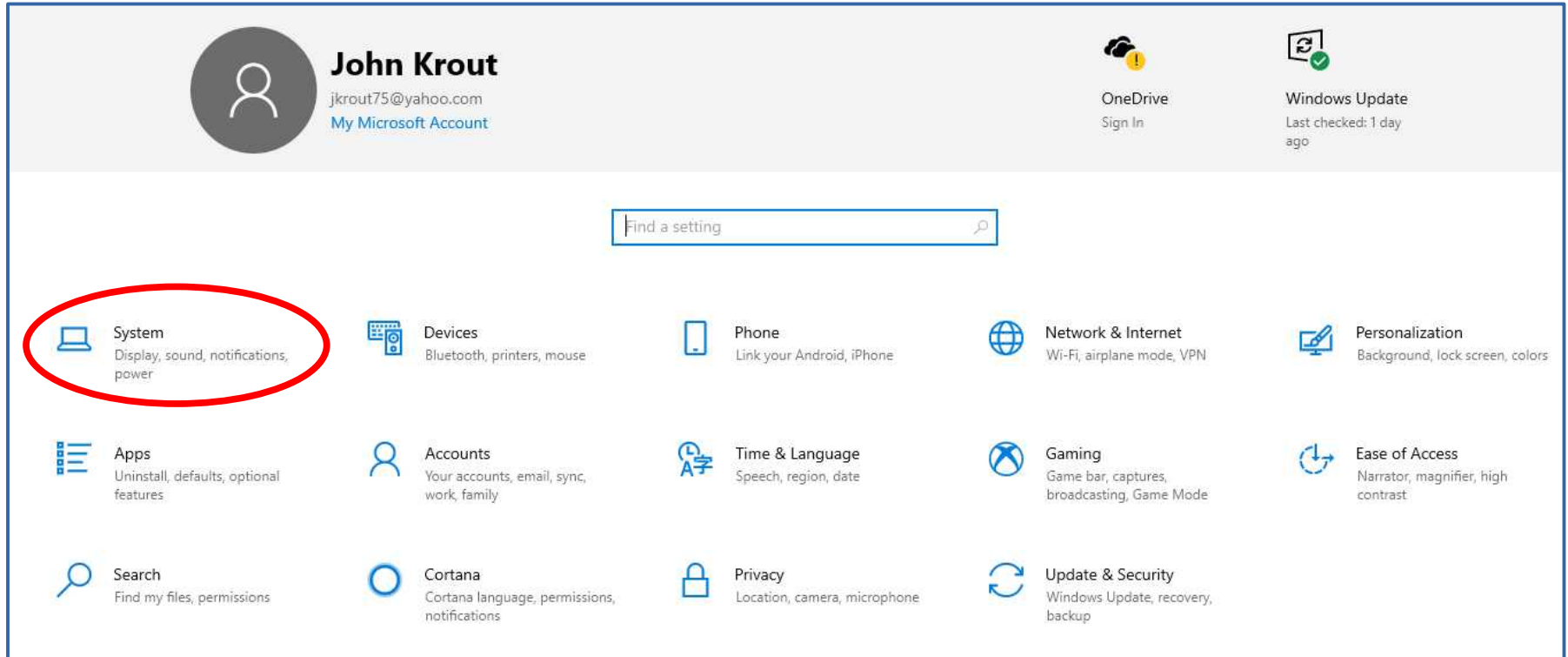
# How to Disable SNAP

1. Open the Windows menu by tapping the  key or clicking the  screen button
2. In the menu, open the **Settings** application



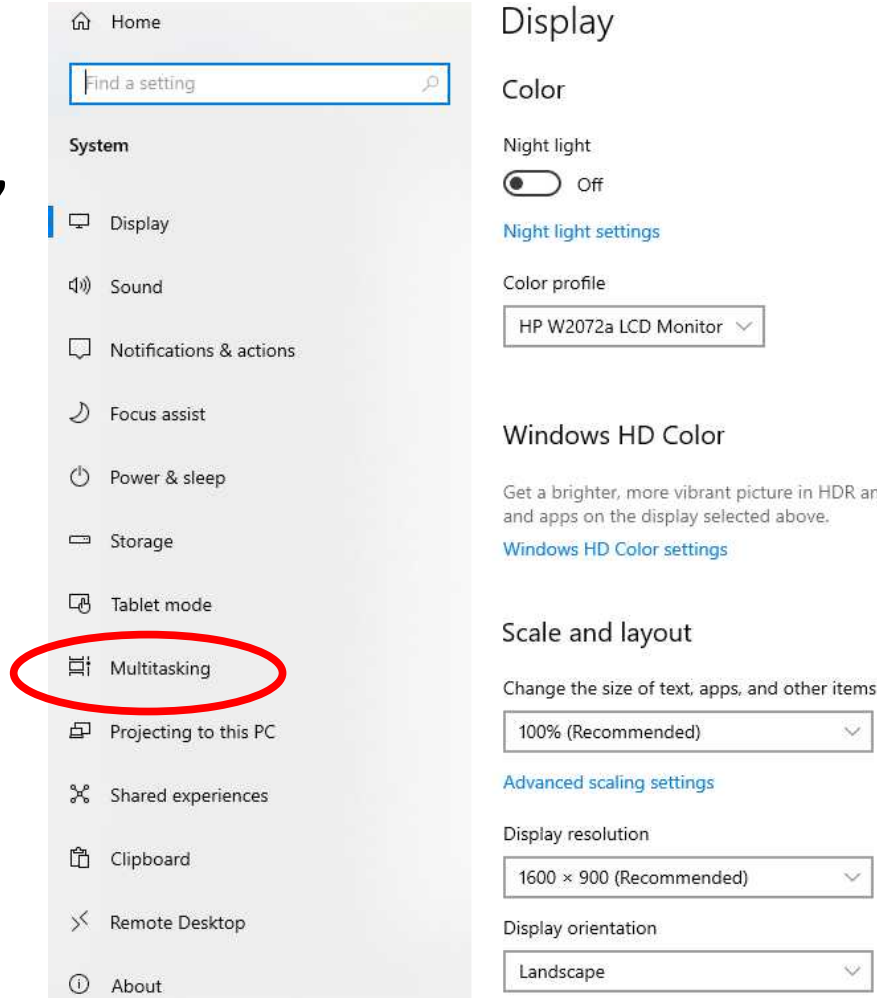
# How to Disable SNAP

## 3. In the Settings application, select **System**



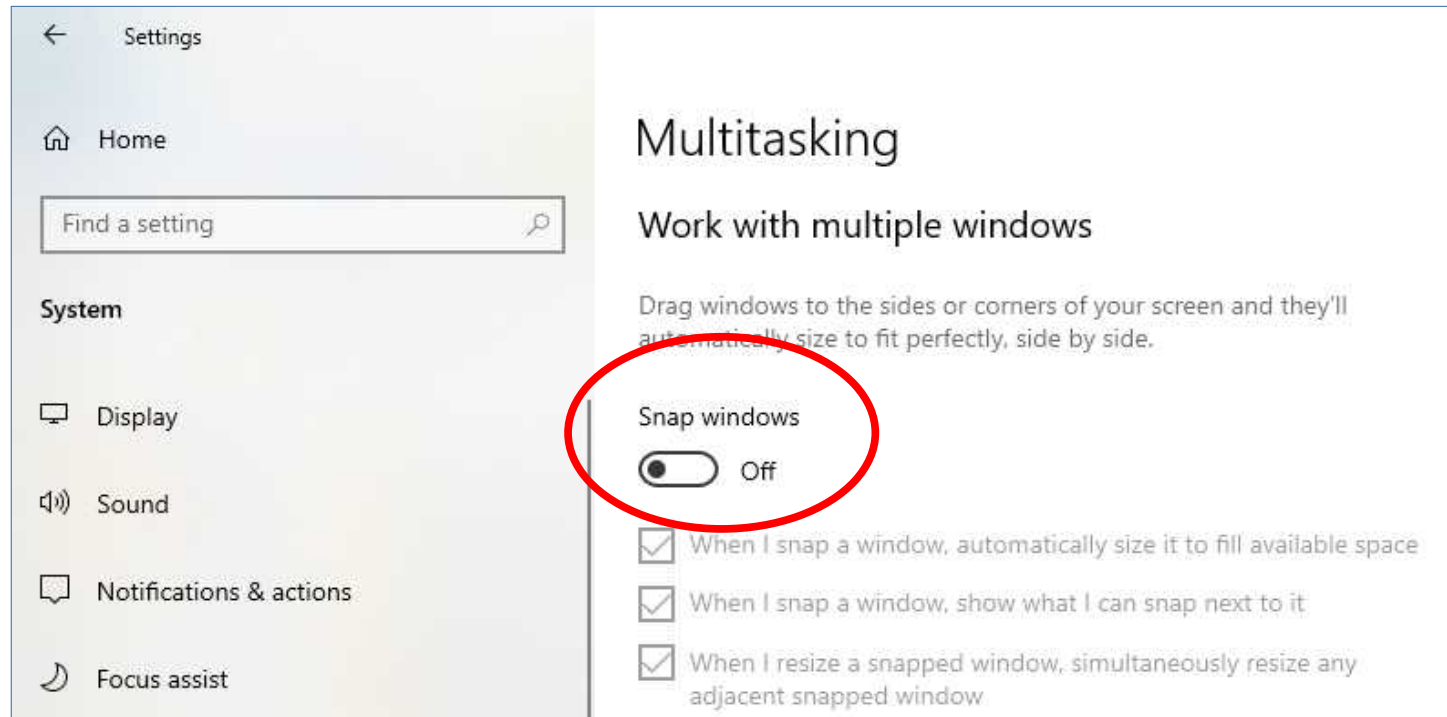
# How to Disable SNAP

4. In the System screen, select **Multitasking** in the left column





# How to Disable SNAP

5. In the Multitasking screen, turn off the SNAP WINDOWS switch.

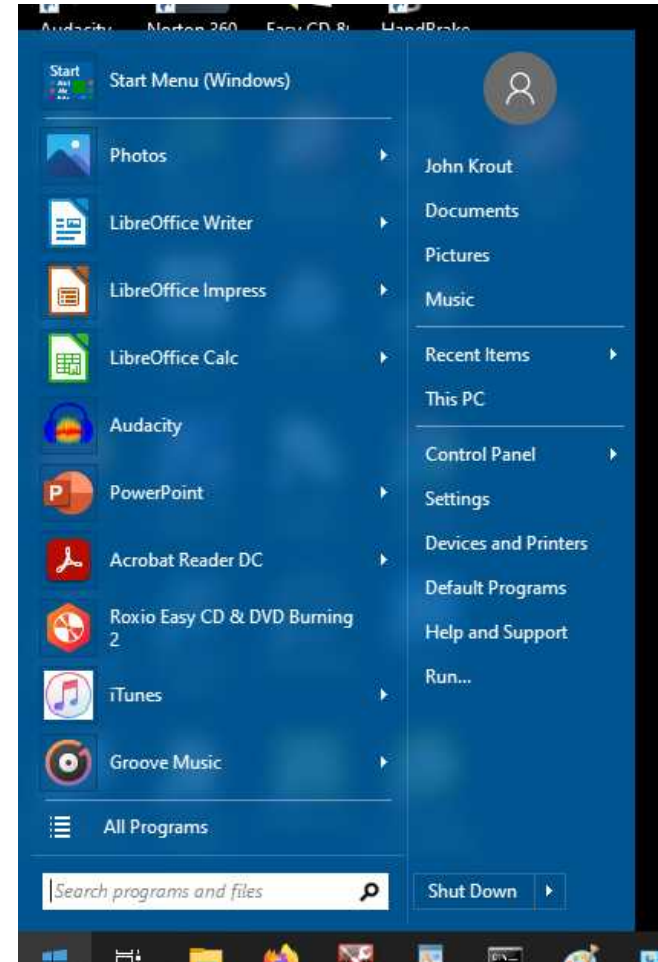


# The Windows main menu

- The Windows 10 menu appears when you tap the  key or click the  button in the lower left corner of your screen
- The default Windows 10 menu combines many of the features I did not like, in the Metro style of Windows 8

# A streamlined menu for Windows 10
